Erin's Law- Quick Overview

≻Law went into effect April 4, 2023

Focus is on sexual abuse prevention & dating violence prevention

≻2 main phases of the law

 \checkmark Educator and Staff Training

✓ Student Education Training



Curriculum Requirements

• Every grade, **K-12**, must include one hour of the following

 K-6 required education focusing on sexual abuse prevention- 1 hour ANNUALLY
 7-12 required to focus on dating and sexual violence prevention- 1 hour ONE TIME DURING THESE YEARS

✓ No state requirement to use a specific program

✓ Each district shall notify parents and legal guardians about the instruction



Staff Training

• Staff training must incorporate content on child sexual abuse

• Teachers, Nurses, Counselors, School Psychologists, and Administrators must complete in service training

• May be provided in person or online, synchronous or asynchronous

SAVE STUDENT'S ACT



SAVE Students Act- Quick Overview

- ≻Law went into effect March 2021
- Focus is on school security, physical & emotional safety, and suicide & violence prevention
- >2 main phases of the law implemented over three-year span
 - ✓ Anonymous Reporting System (2021-2022)
 - ✓ Curriculum Requirements (July 1, 2023)



Curriculum Requirements

• Every grade, 6-12, must include one hour each of the following annually

Suicide Awareness and Prevention- 1 hour
Safety Training & Violence Prevention- 1 hour
Social Inclusion- 1 hour

✓ Can be one standard classroom period or one hour

✓ Each district must use an Ohio DE&W approved training program

✓ Must have an opt out process



Curriculum Detail

- Each grade level 6-12 has developmentally age-appropriate content
- Each grade will have lessons and activities to complete in the classroom
 > Videos, worksheets, small group activities, reflection activities
