Graduation Requirements - Class of 2025

- 4 credits of English (English 9,10,11&12)
- ▶ 4 credits of Math (Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra 2)
- ▶ 3 credits of Social Studies (American History, Government, and World History)
- ▶ 3 credits of Science (Biology, Physical Science and an elective Science)
- ▶ 1 credit of Fine Arts (not required for students who complete their Career Center program)
- .5 credit of Health

Graduation Requirements - Class of 2025 (continued)

- .5 credits of Physical Education
 - May be exempted by 2 seasons of High School Interscholastic Sports, Marching Band, Cheerleading or JROTC
- 5 Elective credits (ACT/SAT prep is HIGHLY recommended for all College Prep and Advanced students)
- Financial Literacy Requirement
 - May be met through HSB 3 or Economics section of American Government (AP Government does NOT include Economics section, students must take HSB 3, Personal Finance, or Summer School Financial Literacy)

Graduation Requirements - Class of 2026 & Beyond

- ▶ 4 credits of English (English 9,10,11&12)
- ▶ 4 credits of Math (Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra 2)
- ▶ 3 credits of Social Studies (American History, Government, World History, and an elective)
- ▶ 3 credits of Science (Biology, Physical Science and an elective Science)
- ▶ 1 credit of Fine Arts (not required for students who complete their Career Center program)
- .5 credit of Health

Graduation Requirements - Class of 2026 & Beyond (continued)

- .5 credits of Physical Education
 - May be exempted by 2 seasons of High School Interscholastic Sports, Marching Band, Cheerleading or JROTC
- .5 credit of Financial Literacy
- 4.5 Elective credits (ACT/SAT prep is HIGHLY recommended for all College Prep and Advanced students)

Ohio Honors Diploma Requirements

(You must fulfill all but one of the requirements to qualify)

- 4 credits English
- 4 credits Math
- 4 credits Social Studies
- 4 credits Science
- 1 credit Fine or Practical Art
- .5 credit Physical Education
- .5 credit Health
- ▶ .5 Financial Literacy (2025 only has to meet requirement)
- ▶ 3 credits Foreign Language (or 2 years each of 2 separate languages)
- ▶ GPA of 3.5 (UNWEIGHTED)
 - ACT score of 27 or SAT score of 1280



Honors Diploma Options

The State of Ohio has developed new alternative Honors Diploma Options. In addition to the traditional Academic Diploma with Honors, students have the option of obtaining the following new options:

- Career Tech Honors Diploma
- STEM Honors Diploma
- Arts Honors Diploma
- Social Science and Civic Engagement Honors Diploma

Course Change Policy

- NO changes in course selection will be made after the last day of school!!!!! (this includes adding/dropping study halls)
- All students will be given their schedule before school is released (usually first week of May)
- After May 22, 2024, NO changes can be made to either semester.

College Credit Plus

- Any student who is wanting to be eligible for college credit must complete the following:
 - Students must sign a letter of intent by April 1st
 - Students must apply and be accepted for student status at the individual college by that college's deadline
 - Students must register for the individual classes by the college's deadline.

- > Math- CCP Statistics (full year) AP Stats will no longer be offered
- PE- Stress Relief & Wellness (semester)
- Hope Squad (full year) by nomination only...is not listed on registration sheets. Students will be called down for schedule discussion

Common Registration Questions



- How many classes do I need to sign up for?
 - · A FULL schedule (7 bells)
- Do I need a foreign language to graduate?
 - No, but colleges recommend or require 2 years of the SAME language.
- What if I applied to go to Diamond Oaks next year?
 - You still need to register normally for a full schedule! Then we will remove your requests once you have officially been accepted.

Common Registration Questions

- Do I have to take the AP test if I have an AP class?
 - Yes. You will be charged for the test through your school fees at the beginning of the year.
- Can I schedule a Study Hall?
 - No (Study Hall may be scheduled for you as needed, after you receive your schedule, you can contact your counselor before May 22nd to add a study hall)
- Can I retake a class that I have already passed?
 - At this time, the only classes that are available for duplicate credit are Band, Choir, Contemporary World Issues, Journalism, and TV Production & Broadcast.



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
