) Legislative Impacts

- State cuts = \$2M Loss per Year (10% of State Support)
- Southwest Among Only 6 Districts With >\$1.5M Loss in 2027
- HB15: Reduces Utility Tax Valuations → \$300K/Year Loss
- Federal Title I Cuts → \$250K Loss in FY26
- Future Impacts Possible With HB186, HB129, HB309
- These Legislative Impacts Could Result in an Additional \$3M -\$6M Loss in Planned Funding



Levy Options Considered by Board

- 0.25% Earned Income Increase → \$2.5M (Reductions Still Required)
- 0.50% Earned Income Increase → \$5.0M (No Reductions Needed)
- 3 Mill Operating Levy → \$3.19M (Fixed Revenue)
- 4 Mill Operating Levy → \$4.26M (Fixed Revenue)
- 5 Mill Operating Levy → \$5.32M (Fixed Revenue)
- Under the Override of Veto Item No. 66, Districts Not in Fiscal Emergency Can No Longer Place New Emergency or Replacement Levies on the Ballot > Effective October 1, 2025



How Property Tax is Calculated

- Example: \$100K Home Value
- Assessed at 35% → \$35K
- \$1 per \$35K in Valuation = \$35 per Mill per \$100K in Total Home Value/\$35K in Assessed Valuation

The Home Impact In Harrison, Ohio

Average Home

Value = \$221K

Average Home Income

= \$100K



Revenue From 1 Average Home = \$5.842:

> State Aid: \$2.774 Earned Income: \$750 Property Tax: \$1,547 Other: \$771



Cost to Educate 1 Student = \$12.954

Net Loss: \$7,112 per Student Household
