- Highest Student-to-Staff Ratio in Hamilton County
- 2nd Lowest Tax Rate in Hamilton County Behind Indian Hill






State Level Changes Driving Changes

FACTS on House Bill 96

- State's Biennium Budget (House Bill 96 & Processes)
- State Cut Nearly \$2M in Aid to Southwest (We had planned for a \$1M increase)
- Private School Vouchers Receiving Significant Increases in State Aid
- Current Legislation Could Reduce Future Tax Revenues From the State:
 - > **HB15** Reduced Public Utility Taxes
 - HB129 School District Income Taxes Included in 20-Mill Floor
 - HB186 Limits Increases in Valuation for 20-Mill Floor Districts
 - ➤ **HB309** Modifies County Budget Commissions

- Southwest Is **1** of Only **6** Districts Cut by Over **\$1.5M** in 2027
- 12th Largest Cut in Ohio as a Percentage of State Revenues (-10.4%)
- 17th Largest Total Cut Over the 2-Year Period (\$1,890,596)
- 182 Districts Receive Less Aid
- 24 Districts Lose at Least \$1.2M in Aid Over 2 Years



Where Do We Go From Here?

- We Have <u>TWO</u> Options:
 - #1 Significantly Decrease Spending by \$3M... OR
 - #2 Increase Revenues Through an Operating Tax Levy
 - Levy options include:
 - Real Estate Permanent Levy
 - Real Estate Emergency Levy
 - Earned Income Tax.
 - All Levies (Except the Permanent Levy)
 Can Be Limited to a Set Time Period



Activity

- Balance the Budget
 - Working through Tough Decisions to Make Cost Reductions
 Necessary to Balance the Budget after State Cuts
