2026-2027 College Credit Plus Participation Contract

Program Overview:

College Credit Plus (CCP) allows eligible students entering grades 7-12 to take approved college courses for both high school and college credit. By participating, the student and parent/guardian acknowledge understanding of academic expectations, financial responsibilities (when applicable), and the permanent effect of college grades on transcripts.

Credit Load Requirement:

Students are required to be enrolled in a minimum of **7.5 total credit hours** each semester for full time and eligibility (between high school and CCP classes if participating in off-campus CCP courses). Students may not exceed 30 credit hours per school year (includes summer semester). **If full time CCP, athletes must be in 9 CCP credit hours to stay eligible.** This may consist of:

- 5 high school classes, OR
- 3 CCP college courses (3 credit hour courses), OR
- A combination of high school and CCP courses totaling at least 7.5 credits.

Failure to uphold this defined number of credits will result in being placed in Edgenuity/high school courses if a course is dropped or the credit requirement is not met.

CCP Considerations:

- Consider how these classes will help with both graduation requirements at the high school level and your future career goals.
- Classes at the high school are prioritized, CCP students **do not** receive priority for scheduling. If there is a CCP course that is in person and conflicts with the required high school class, the CCP course will need to be dropped and replaced with an option that does not interfere.

-The CCP courses are more accelerated and academically challenging than courses at the high school level, which requires increased responsibility and organization, as well as a strong academic foundation in the related coursework.

-CCP courses are weighted if there is the equivalent weighted course offered at the high school level, (i.e English, Math, Science, History, Foreign Language). Please see your guidance counselor for questions and clarification on the courses that count for this.

Steps to Follow:

1. Attend the CCP informational meeting.
2. Meet with your school counselor.
3. Turn in CCP Contract and Letter of Intent to your school counselor by April 1, 2026.
4. Apply to the college of your choice (University of Cincinnati Blue Ash, Miami University, Sinclair, Cincinnati State, etc.)
5. Once accepted, complete the orientation(if stated), and set up a meeting with your assigned CCP academic advisor (from your acceptance email).
6. Register for your CCP classes.
7. Meet with your school counselor to go over registered classes and schedule fixes, if necessary.

Student Responsibilities:

- Maintain academic integrity and follow the codes of conduct of both the high school and the college.
- Attend all scheduled classes and complete coursework and assessments by required deadlines.
- Communicate directly with college instructors regarding coursework, questions, and academic needs.
- Check email/learning platforms regularly.
- Ensure you are enrolled in at least 7.5 total credits each semester through high school courses, CCP courses, or a combination of both.
- Monitor and adhere to college registration, add/drop, and withdrawal deadlines.
- Understand that all CCP grades are permanent, appear on both high school and college transcripts, and impact GPA.
- **Notify the school counselor prior to dropping or withdrawing from any CCP course.**

Parent/Guardian Responsibilities:

- Acknowledge that CCP courses may include adult content and college-level expectations.

- Understand that college instructors communicate directly with the student, not parents.
- Recognize that college grades are permanent and may affect graduation progress, NCAA eligibility, and future financial aid.

Financial Considerations

- If the student fails a course, withdraws past the university deadline, or does not acquire credit from a course, it is the student's responsibility to pay William Henry Harrison High School for the course cost and any other associated costs.
- If a student fails a course, they will be placed on CCP academic probation for the following semester. If they fail another course, they will be dismissed from being able to participate in taking any future CCP courses.
