WAIT: AP v. CCP Differences

AP: Advanced Placement	CCP: College Credit Plus
• High school course with a standardized AP exam in May • College credit depends on: -Your exam score -The college's policy • Grade stays on your high school transcript	• Actual college course • Earn college credit by passing the class • Grade appears on: - High school transcript - College transcript

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What is CCP?

- College Credit Plus allows students to earn college and high school credit at the same time.
- Take classes at Harrison, or through a college campus (in person on campus or online).

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Who should consider CCP?

- Students going into grades 7-12 are eligible for CCP courses.
- Academically mature and responsible students are a great fit who can handle college level coursework.

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CCP AT Harrison High School

- English- College Writing 1 and College Writing 2
- Math- Elementary Statistics
- Speech- Public Speaking
- Spanish- Elementary Spanish 1 and 2
- IT
- Engineering

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CCP Off Campus

- If you would like to take CCP off campus (not one of the classes we offer at WHHHS), you are able to do so at any participating Ohio public university.
- You can take them through the college campuses in person or online.
- Most Harrison students do off campus CCP through UC, Miami, or Cincinnati State.
- **If you attend off campus CCP courses, YOU are responsible for your own transportation.**

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Benefits of CCP

- Earn dual credit for both your high school graduation requirements, and college credits.
- College credit guaranteed as long as you earn the passing grade stated for the course. Transfers to any college in Ohio, out of state is case by case.
- Free!
- You can explore courses that are not offered at WHHHS and explore courses related to your major without paying for them in college.
- Exposure to college level courses.

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CCP Considerations

- CCP courses are real college classes. They are fast pace and require a lot of self discipline.
- Your CCP course grades are on BOTH your high school transcript and college transcript, so they need to be taken seriously.
- You are an adult to your professors, meaning if you need something or have an issue, the student (not parent) is responsible for fixing it. Professors will not respond to parents.

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Credits/Eligibility Reminders

- Students are able to take 30 credit hours per academic year total, this includes the summer term leading up to the school year (any classes taken in Summer 2026 would count towards the credit hours for the 26-27 school year).
- Most college courses are worth 3 credit hours per class per semester but some are worth less or more, each of these adds to the 30.
- Each SEMESTER of a high school class is equal to 1.5 credit hours, since 3 credit hours is equal to 1 credit of a course at the high school.
- Students must be in 5 classes (can be a combination of WHHHS classes and CCP off campus classes), or enough to equate to 7.5 credit hours each semester.
- Athletes must be enrolled in and passing at least 5 classes to remain eligible (or 7.5 credit hours if doing a combination of CCP or full time CCP).

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Required Paperwork and Deadlines

- Must review and sign CCP Contract
- Must sign Letter of Intent
- State deadline for Summer/Fall semesters for 2026 is APRIL 1st to turn this paperwork in, EVEN if you have already been a CCP student before.
- No late submissions will be accepted.

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Steps to Follow:

1. Student and parent attend required CCP meeting
2. Review and sign CCP contract and Letter of Intent
3. Meet 1:1 with your counselor to review and discuss CCP, and turn in forms.
4. Apply as a CCP student to the university of your choice (if off campus) or apply to the college for the CCP course you are taking at Harrison.
5. Complete any orientation items and schedule a meeting with your assigned CCP advisor to schedule classes.
6. COMMUNICATE your classes to your school counselor PRIOR to the start of the school year.

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Disclaimers:

- Credits may not transfer to schools out of Ohio. It depends on the school.
- You and your student are responsible for paying for the CCP courses if your student is to fail it.
- Your student may be placed on CCP probation or dismissed from participating if they do not pass a class.

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Wrapping Up

- Please take all of this into consideration when deciding if CCP is a good fit for your student, we want them to challenge themselves but still be successful!
- Talk with students/parents and your counselor about if CCP is right for you.

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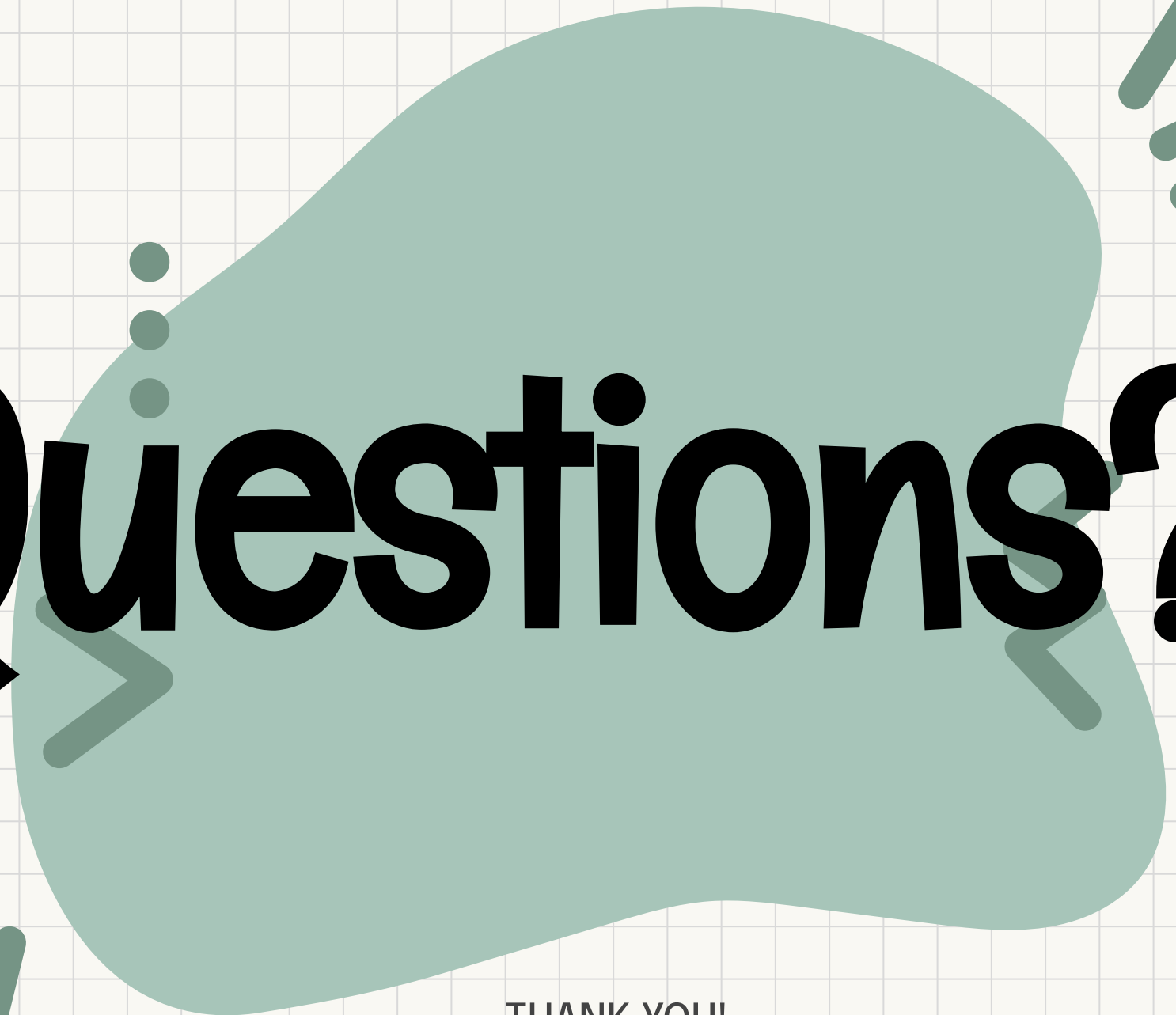
