## **Senior Events**

### **Senior Play Day/Senior Banquet**

**Senior Day is Thursday, May 14** and is a **required day of attendance**. Any student who does not go to Northern Kentucky University with the class is expected to be in school. Besides transportation and lunch being provided, students will also have access to spaces at NKU's Campus Recreation Center (which includes pools and courts for basketball/volleyball/racquetball). The cost for the entire day is **\$15.00**.

**The Senior Banquet will be held at the Miami Township Community Center (3780 Shady Lane, North Bend, OH 45002) on Monday, May 18<sup>th</sup>, from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m.** This senior-only event will include the senior video, senior superlatives, and dinner. The dress is semi-formal (no jeans or sweatpants). The cost for this event is **\$25.00**.

**NOTE: Tickets will be purchased through Local Level online ONLY. A QR code and link will be sent via Student Square by May 4, 2026.**

### **Athletic, Academic and Military Signing and Awards**

**Athletic signings will be held on Thursday, April 23<sup>rd</sup> at 2:00 p.m.** in the Wildcat Arena.

**Academic and Military signing and awards will be held on Tuesday, May 12<sup>th</sup>** at the Martin Marietta Performing Arts Theatre. **Academic and Military signing will be at 5:30 p.m. and Community Scholarships will be at 6:15 p.m.** Immediately following will be the annual **Senior Academic Awards Night program beginning at 7:30 p.m.** followed by the Senior Scholarship video. If your student is recognized on this evening, you will receive an invitation in the mail.

### **Graduation Practice**

**Mandatory Graduation practice will be held in the Wildcat Sports Arena on Tuesday, May 19<sup>th</sup> from 8:30 a.m. – 11:30 a.m.**

**REMINDER – Attendance at Graduation practice is REQUIRED for all who plan to participate in the graduation ceremony. If you do not plan to walk at graduation, contact Mrs. Frey at 513-728-8425 by Monday, May 4<sup>th</sup>. For students that do not walk at graduation they may pick up their diploma on or after Tuesday, June 2<sup>nd</sup> providing the office is open. Please call the school before you arrive at 513-367-4169. All disciplinary and delinquent obligations **MUST** be settled, or arrangements approved by an administrator prior to attending graduation practice.**

## Commencement Information

1. The ceremony will be as follows:
  - **ALL** graduates will need to arrive no later than 6:30 pm.
  - The number of graduation tickets for students' families will be seven (7) tickets per student. **Graduation tickets will be handed out to students at the end of graduation practice on Tuesday, May 19, 2026.** If you are not in need of all the tickets, please return the unused tickets.



2. **ALL** graduates should report to the staging area (hallways adjacent to Gym) no later than **6:30 pm**. All graduates will process in for the 7:30 pm ceremony. We will review this in detail with the seniors during graduation practice.
3. The commencement ceremonies will be broadcast via closed circuit TV to the Auditorium area for those preferring to view in this manner. There is no ticket needed to view the ceremony in the Auditorium.
4. Special handicapped seating will be available upon request. Please contact Mrs. Frey at 513-728-8425 (direct line) for specific details. **We ask you to call by Monday, May 4<sup>th</sup> to allow for adequate reserved seating on the night of graduation.**

## **The Ceremony**

The William Henry Harrison High School Commencement is a ceremony, not a celebration, and as such, will be conducted with dignity and respect. Graduates, parents, and guests are reminded that, out of respect to all members of the Class of 2026, anything that detracts from the dignity of the ceremony will not be permitted. Because Commencement is a formal ceremony involving over 340 students, certain standards have been established.

In accordance with Southwest Local Schools Board of Education Policies and Procedures, all academic requirements must be met in advance and in full to be permitted to participate in graduation rehearsal and the commencement exercises. Participation in commencement is optional and is also a privilege, not a right. Graduates wishing to participate in the ceremony must adhere to the guidelines and rules established by the school.

## **Commencement Ceremony Details**

### **Attire:**

#### **Cap and Gown**

1. Students will wear caps and gowns as prescribed by the school; students may not alter and/or decorate their cap or gown in any way. Only cords and stoles issued by William Henry Harrison High School or Great Oaks may be worn.
2. Required Dress:
  - a. Males- White dress shirt, dark slacks, dark socks, and dark shoes. Ties are recommended but not required. Jeans, shorts and gym shoes are **NOT** permitted.
  - b. Females- White or light-colored dress, not to go below the outer gown. White/Nude dress shoes or sandals should be worn. Flip Flops and Crocs are **NOT** permitted.
3. **NO CHEWING GUM**
4. Ordered Caps and Gowns will be delivered during lunch on April 28, 2026, for Harrison High School students and on May 1, 2026, for Great Oaks students.
5. Please have your student try on the Cap and Gown immediately. If you do need to adjust, please contact Graduate Services at 513-272-5890 immediately. WHHHS does not have extra Caps and Gowns.
6. **Any student who has not ordered a Cap and Gown, please contact Graduate Services immediately to do so at 513-272-5890.**
7. Graduates will not be allowed to carry anything into the graduation ceremony that is not part of the ceremony, including purses, cameras, or **CELL PHONES**.
8. Any student reporting to graduation dressed improperly will **NOT** have the privilege of participating in graduation.

### **Pictures**

1. Students will know their seat location after graduation rehearsal on May 19<sup>th</sup>.
2. Pictures must be taken from the seating area. Only Commencement personnel and seniors will be allowed on the floor of the Wildcat Arena during the ceremony.



3. Ritchie Photography (513) 941-6120 will take pictures as students receive their diplomas. After graduation, information will be mailed to the seniors about purchasing pictures. Contact them with questions.

## **Graduation Requirements**

The first requirement for graduation is that students at William Henry Harrison High School must earn a minimum of 21 Credits to be eligible for graduation. Among the credits necessary for graduation, the following are required:

\*Students planning to attend a public college or university in Ohio must have one credit in Fine Arts, which can only be fulfilled by taking music or art courses. Students completing a Career Based Vocational program do not have to obtain a full credit in the Fine Arts but may have to fulfill the requirement still if they are planning to attend a public college or university in Ohio.

\*\*\* Students **must meet the financial literacy requirement as set by the state.** This requirement is met when completing a FULL credit of American Government or American Government CP course or by completing the approved Financial Literacy class online for an additional fee.

\*The deadline for senior completion of Edgenuity classes to participate in the commencement ceremony is **Friday, May 8<sup>th</sup>**.



## **Additional Requirement to Receive a Diploma from William Henry Harrison High School**

- Earn a passing score in Ohio's high school Algebra 1 and English 2 test **OR** fulfill 1 of 3 graduation options along with earning 2 diploma seals. For details, please see your counselor.
- All School fees must be paid in full, textbooks, computers, chargers, and library materials returned, and all other obligations fulfilled prior to graduation.
- Although the school will make every effort prior to graduation day to contact parents of those seniors who have failed to meet academic requirements, it is ultimately the student's responsibility to make certain those requirements and other obligations are met.

### **Important Miscellaneous Items**

1. **Academic Requirements:** We will make every effort prior to graduation day to contact the parents of those seniors who have failed to meet academic requirements.
2. **Graduation Survey & Information for the Commencement Program:** Each senior will have the opportunity to complete their Graduation Survey online on April 15<sup>th</sup> during their Advisory period. The deadline to complete the Graduation Survey is April 24, 2026. The information submitted in these surveys will be used for the slide presentation at Awards Night as well as Academic Signing, the commencement program and for sending transcripts. Remember students cannot be recognized for a scholarship that we do not know about. All scholarship information should be channeled through each student's Guidance Counselor. **Graduation Surveys must be completed to participate in the Graduation Ceremony.**
3. **Academic Signing:** Students who will be receiving 50% or more of college tuition in scholarship money will be recognized at the Academic Signing and students entering the armed forces will also have a Military Signing. Again, this information is obtained from the Graduation Survey which is due April 24<sup>th</sup>. Students being recognized will receive information at a later date.
4. **Seniors going to college:** If your student needs a final transcript sent to a college, make sure to let the guidance department know where it should be sent. Seniors should identify the college selected in the final senior survey.
5. **Picking up Diplomas:** Students will receive their diplomas during the graduation ceremony unless they have delinquent obligations. Those students that have delinquent obligations will receive only a diploma cover. Upon full payment of school fees or delinquent obligations, they may pick up their diploma from Kimberly Frey in the high school office after Tuesday, June 2, 2026. Please call the school to make sure the office is open. **Diplomas will not be issued unless all school fees are paid in full, and computers are turned in.**
6. **Senior Pranks:** Any senior who contributes in any way to the disruption of the normal school operation will be subject to disciplinary action. This action may include, but not be limited to, being denied participation in Commencement on May 21, 2026. Any graduate participating in or contributing to inappropriate behavior during Commencement will be removed.
