* Includes carry overs from previous week (or from summer break). Positive cases = isolated for 10 days; close contacts / quarantine = 7, 10, or 14 days). The Hamilton County Department of Health quarantines students per ORC 3707.11. SLSD assists with contact tracing on a case by case basis.

When students are masked up / or vaccinated, they are NOT subject to quarantine. For those CHOOSING to not mask up or get vaccinated, above quarantine rules apply.

*New STAFF cases for Aug. 16 - 22: 1 (This case was a third-party employee and was prior to school starting).

*New STUDENT cases for Aug. 16 – 22: 17 (16 of 17 confirmed / medically diagnosed pos. student cases were prior to school starting). As of today, 5 remain positive.

Important: When / if we see significant numbers of students and / or staff out due to COVID, we will be forced to either conduct remote instruction or to mandate masks in the schools where this is the case. It is important that families are prepared for either scenario. When masks are required in schools, students do not miss school due to quarantine. As we have said numerous times, out #1 priority is safety and keeping kids learning IN SCHOOL.
