When students are masked up / or vaccinated, they are NOT subject to quarantine. For those CHOOSING to not mask up or get vaccinated, above quarantine rules apply. Obviously, this situation is very fluid. Please work with us, not against us, as we continue to focus on educating our students face to face this fall!

Important: When we see significant numbers of students and / or staff out due to COVID, we will be forced to either universally mask or conduct remote instruction. Like last year, we will do this by building to start. It is important that families are prepared for either scenario. When there is universal masking in schools, students do not miss face to face instruction due to quarantine. As we have said numerous times, our #1 priority is safety and keeping kids learning IN SCHOOL. Currently, the HS and JS are universally masked, building wide. Crosby has one 3rd grade class remote and one 3rd grade class masked.
