* Includes carry overs from previous week. Positive cases = isolated for 10 days; close contacts / quarantine = 7, 10, or 14 days. The Hamilton County Department of Health quarantines students per ORC 3707.11. SLSD assists with contact tracing on a case-by-case basis. When students are masked up / or vaccinated, they are NOT subject to quarantine.

Important: When we see significant numbers of students and / or staff out due to COVID, we will shift to either universal masking or remote instruction.
